



IRAN REJECTS OBAMA'S IRAN NUKE PACT, WRITES OWN 'DEAL' TO DISARM ISRAEL

October 15, 2015 Breitbart.com reported: "The Iranian parliament has rejected the formal, legal text of President Barack Obama's nuclear deal, negotiated in July by the U.S., U.K., France, Germany, Russia, China and the Tehran regime.

Instead, the majilis approved their own version of the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA), creating a situation where the Iranian government simply hasn't signed on to the accord that Obama and Democratic Senators obligated the United States to uphold. Western media incorrectly reported that the majilis approved the actual text of the JCPOA, according to experts.

ISIS TELLS ASSYRIAN CHRISTIANS IN SWEDEN: 'CONVERT OR DIE: THE CALIPHATE IS HERE'

October 15, 2015 Breitbart.com reported: "Assyrian Christians living in Sweden have been targeted with a string of threatening messages linked to the Islamic State, including demands that they 'convert or die.'

A recent report by Swedish daily Dagens Nyheter revealed that the Assyrian community in the city of Gothenburg, in southwestern Sweden, is being menaced by unidentified aggressors using known Islamic State methods and symbols. According to reports, local police are investigating the threats, but so far have found nothing.

The town of Gothenburg is a hotbed for jihadist recruiting, and the Swedish newspaper Aftonbladet earlier this year reported that at least 150 people had left the city to join the Islamic State in Iraq and Syria. Terrorism expert Magnus Ranstorp has called Gothenburg 'the Swedish Center for Jihadists,' and the town with a population of a half million has contributed more fighters to ISIS than the entire United States of America.

On Tuesday, Swedish Assyrian Markus Samuelsson found the walls of his restaurant in Gothenburg covered in jihadist graffiti, including messages of 'Convert or Die' and 'The Caliphate is Here.'..."

SAUDIS, ISIS, AL-QAEDA AGREE: TIME FOR JIHAD AGAINST RUSSIA

October 14, 2015 Breitbart.com reported: "The leader of al-Qaeda linked group al-Nusra Front is encouraging jihadists in the Caucasus to attack Russia. His call follows similar condemnation of Russia from rival jihadi group the Islamic State (ISIS) and a number of Saudi clerics.

'If the Russian army kills the people of Syria, then kill their people. And if they kill our soldiers, then kill their soldiers. An eye for an eye,' declared Abu Mohamed al-Jolani.

Russia began airstrikes on September 30. Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov told the UN Security Council the government received a request from Assad to strike the rebels. Russia has stated they are only targeting the Islamic State (ISIS/ISIL), but insiders claim the airstrikes have hit any faction considered an enemy of Assad. Jolani said these attacks are 'a new Christian crusade from the east that was doomed to fail.'

'The war in Syria will make the Russians forget the horrors that they found in Afghanistan,' continued Jolani. 'They will be shattered, with God's permission, on Syria's doorstep.'..."

RENEWED CHINA WOES DRAG ASIAN MARKETS AFTER MORE WEAK DATA

October 14, 2015 AFP reported: "Worries about the slowdown in Chinese growth kept the pressure on Asian financial markets Wednesday, with traders following their US and European counterparts to the sidelines, pushing most risk assets lower. However, news that consumer inflation in China had eased in September while producer prices plunged fed hopes Beijing will launch another round of stimulus as leaders struggle to get a handle on the country's deepening economic crisis.

A recent rally across global equities and currency markets this month was brought to a halt Tuesday when China released figures showing imports plunged by more than a fifth in September while exports also declined. And on Wednesday official figures showed inflation weakened last month from August, while the prices paid at factory gates -- a key gauge of demand in the economy -- remained unchanged at a six-year low.

"The cautionary element in the market is likely to continue," Chris Green, an Auckland-based strategist at First NZ Capital, told Bloomberg News.

"In terms of global growth, the risk is skewed towards the downside. A softer read on the Chinese inflation data reinforces the backdrop of deflationary pressures and softer growth profile globally. The Chinese economy is probably the largest risk that the global economy faces at this point."

Analysts have said the latest soft readings have raised hopes for another batch of monetary easing out of Beijing, following five interest rate cuts since November.

"China remains a source of market debate," said Evan Lucas of IG in Melbourne.

"The bears see a hard-landing as inevitable, the bulls continue to see bright spots here and there, and have an unrelenting belief that the (People's Bank of China) will be the shining white knight riding in with a rate slashing sword to save the day."

On equities markets, dealers tracked losses on Wall Street and across Europe. Shanghai was 0.82 percent lower, Hong Kong lost 0.99 percent and Sydney -- where several firms that rely on Chinese trade are listed -- was 0.47 percent off. Tokyo tumbled 1.83 percent with exporters hit by a stronger yen as investors, spooked by new growth fears, shifted into assets considered safe bets.

"The dollar surrendered some strength as fresh signs of a weakening world economy seemingly tossed a US rate hike further into the future," said Joe Manimbo of Western Union Business Solutions...

Manimbo said the greenback fell after the Chinese trade data as well as news that British prices slid in September and investor sentiment in Germany slumped to its lowest level in a year. The greenback was at 119.58 yen compared with 119.72 yen in New York Tuesday. The dollar had been rallying for most of the year on expectations the Federal Reserve would raise interest rates before 2016.

However, central bank policy makers have turned dovish in recent weeks -- helping emerging markets currencies -- owing to turmoil on global markets caused by the China crisis."..."

IRAN-BACKED HOUTHIS GIVE YEMEN'S LAST JEWS AN ULTIMATUM: CONVERT OR LEAVE

October 13, 2015 Breitbart.com reported: "The Iranian-backed Houthi insurgency in Yemen has given the country's few remaining Jewish citizens an ultimatum: either convert to Islam or be exiled immediately. Israeli Regional Cooperation Minister Ayoub Kara, a Druze lawmaker, told the Jerusalem Post on Sunday that Yemen's Jewish community reached out to him with the panicked message. Yemen's ancient Jewish community, which predates Islam by over a thousand years, were told to 'convert or leave the state,' Kara said, adding that Yemen's Jewish leaders 'requested that I' do something about their plight.

The Houthi terrorists in Yemen, who are backed by Iran, are notoriously anti-American and anti-Semitic, as proven by their motto, 'God is Great, Death to America, Death to Israel, Curse on the Jews, Victory to Islam.' IRAN CLAIMS HOUTHIS DESTROY SAUDI OR EGYPTIAN WARSHIP OFF YEMEN

October 12, 2015 Arutz Sheva reported: "On Sunday, multiple Iranian news outlets claimed that the Yemeni-based Iranian-proxy Houthi rebels destroyed either a Saudi or an Egyptian warship in the Bab-el-Mandeb Straits, which lies between Yemen to the east and Djibouti and Eritrea on the Horn of Africa.

The Bab al-Mandab Strait connects the Red Sea to the Gulf of Aden. At its narrowest the el-Mandeb Strait is about 16 miles. The el-Mandeb Strait is a geo-strategic choke-point and estimated to transit about 3.3 million barrels of oil a day, or about 8% of the world's oil shipped daily by tanker.

The Iranian sources claim that the Houthi 'forces fired rockets at a Saudi-led coalition warship and destroyed it near al-Mukha coast in the Yemeni province of Ta'iz.' They further alleged that the destroyed warship was named 'al-Mahrousa' and belonged to the Egyptian navy. A search for that Egyptian ship 'al Mahrousa' showed the ship to be the current official yacht of the Egyptian President and not an Egyptian warship..."

NORTH KOREA SHOWCASES NEW 'NUCLEAR' LONG-RANGE MISSILE: STATE TV

October 12, 2015 SpaceDaily.com reported: "North Korea on Saturday showed off what it said were long-range ballistic missiles carrying miniaturized nuclear warheads, its latest claim to the sophisticated technology which state television said could destroy enemies in a 'sea of fire'.



Rows of the intercontinental ballistic missiles known as KN-08, which some think could fly far enough to reach the continental US, were paraded through the capital as part of a massive military parade marking the 70th anniversary of the ruling Workers Party.

A defence analyst in Seoul said the new missile appeared to have been modified to allow it to be fitted with a miniature nuclear warhead — a claim echoed by North Korea's state TV — but others experts said it was impossible to tell.

North Korea has long claimed it has technology capable of launching nuclear bombs at its distant enemies, but experts are sceptical whether the impoverished country has acquired the sophisticated technology needed to produce such weapons.

'With the vengeful desire to turn the citadel of our enemies into a sea of fire, our powerful tactical rockets loaded with diversified and miniaturised nuclear warheads are on the move,' the commentator said, as rows of missiles were shown on screen..."
