Denmark May Force Churches to Submit Sermons to Gov't: 'There Is Much Concern,' Pastor Says

February 4, 2021 christianheadlines.com reported: "A proposed Danish law that would require sermons be translated and submitted to the government has sparked concern among Christians throughout the region.

The proposed legislation would require that all sermons not delivered in the country's native language be translated into Danish and submitted to the government, although it is not clear yet if the sermons must be submitted before or after they are delivered. The bill has the backing of Prime Minister Mette Frederiksen.

Although the legislation is intended to control radical Muslim groups in the country – more than 250,000 Muslims live in Denmark – it has drawn pushback from many Christians.

Anglican Bishop Robert Innes of the European diocese wrote a letter to Frederiksen Jan. 27, expressing concern over the proposal's impact on religious liberty..."

UN court says it can hear Iran-US sanctions case

February 4, 2021 spacewar.com reported: "The UN's top court has said it can hear Iran's bid to overturn US nuclear sanctions reimposed by Donald Trump, prompting "disappointment" in Washington, which had argued the issue lies outside its jurisdiction.

Iran's foreign minister swiftly hailed Wednesday's decision as a "victory" in the case launched three years ago at the International Court of Justice (ICJ) in The Hague.

Tehran alleges that Trump, when he was US president, breached a 1955 friendship treaty between the two countries by pulling out of a 2015 nuclear deal -- to the dismay of European allies -- and reactivating the sanctions.

Washington had said The Hague-based ICJ did not have jurisdiction and must throw out the case. It also argued the sanctions were necessary because Iran posed a "grave threat" to international security. But judges at the court rejected all the US objections.

ICJ President Abdulqawi Ahmed Yusuf said the tribunal "finds consequently that it has jurisdiction.... to entertain the application filed by the Islamic Republic of Iran".

The US State Department said it was "disappointed" by the decision." ..."

U.S. Navy Has Patents on Tech It Says Will 'Engineer the Fabric of Reality'

February 3, 2021 vice.com reported: The U.S. Navy has patents on weird and little understood technology. According to patents filed by the Navy, it is working on a compact fusion reactor that could power cities, an engine that works using "inertial mass reduction," and a "hybrid aerospace-underwater craft." Dubbed the "UFO patents," *The War Zone* has reported that the Navy had to build prototypes of some of the outlandish tech to prove it worked.

Dr. Salvatore Cezar Pais is the man behind the patents and *The War Zone* has proven the man exists, at least on paper. Pais has worked for a number of different departments in the Navy, including the Naval Air Warfare Center Aircraft Division (NAVAIR/NAWCAD) and the Strategic Systems Programs. (SSP) The SSP mission, according to its website, is to "provide credible and affordable strategic solutions to the warfighter." It's responsible for developing the technology behind the Trident class nuclear missiles launched from Submarines.

The patents all build on each other, but at their core is something Pais called the "Pais Effect." This is the idea that, "controlled motion of electrically charged matter via accelerated vibration and/or accelerated spin subjected to smooth yet rapid acceleration transients, in order to generate extremely high energy/high intensity electromagnetic fields."

Essentially, Pais is claiming to use properly spun electromagnetic fields to contain a fusion reaction. That plasma fusion reaction he claims to have invented will revolutionize power consumption. Experts theorize that a functioning fusion reactor would lead to cheap and ubiquitous energy."..."

Taliban Confident It Will Replace Afghanistan Leaders with ‘Islamic Government’

February 3, 2021 breitbart.com reported: “Representatives of the Taliban meeting with Iranian officials in Tehran declared Tuesday that peace talks between the group and the United States would lead to the end of the current Afghan government and the imposition of a more ‘Islamic’ regime, a condition Washington has rejected since the talks began.

Afghanistan is already an Islamic republic, run partially through *sharia*, or Islamic law. The Taliban considers itself the only legitimate government of Afghanistan and formally refers to itself as the ‘Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan,’ rejecting the existence of Afghanistan’s entire government infrastructure. After nearly two decades of war since the United States invaded in the early 2000s, Taliban representatives agreed to negotiations...”

Nuclear war with China or Russia a ‘real possibility,’ STRATCOM commander warns

February 3, 2021 foxnews.com reported: “The head of U.S. Strategic Command is calling for military and federal leaders to reimagine methods of deterring aggressive action from rivals such as China and Russia, including the ‘real possibility’ of nuclear war.

In a stark assessment of the current geopolitical landscape, STRATCOM Commander Adm. Charles Richard warned that China and Russia have ‘begun to aggressively challenge international norms’ in ‘ways not seen since the height of the Cold War.’ Richard cited a rise in cyberattacks and ‘threats in space,’ as well as their investment in advanced arms such as nuclear weapons.

STRATCOM is responsible for the U.S. nuclear deterrent.

‘There is a real possibility that a regional crisis with Russia or China could escalate quickly to a conflict involving nuclear weapons, if they perceived a conventional loss would threaten the regime or state,’ Richard wrote in the February issue of ‘*Proceedings*,’ the U.S. Naval Institute’s monthly magazine...”

Iran launches new satellite-carrying rocket

February 2, 2021 Arutz Sheva 7 reported: “Iranian state TV on Monday aired the launch of the country’s newest satellite-carrying rocket, which it said was able to reach a height of 500 kilometers, *The Associated Press* reported.

The footage of the solid-liquid-fueled rocket showed the launch taking place during daytime in a desert environment. The report did not say when the launch occurred.

The rocket, called Zuljanah for the horse of Imam Hussein, the grandson of the Prophet Muhammad, did not launch a satellite into orbit...”

Blinken: Iran could be weeks away from enough nuclear material for bomb

February 1, 2021 jpost.com reported: “Iran could be ‘weeks away’ from having sufficient material to develop a nuclear weapon if it continues to violate the 2015 nuclear deal, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken warned on Monday.

Blinken said that the Biden administration would consider new sanctions against North Korea as well as other possible actions against Russia. It was the new secretary’s first television interview since taking office last week.

He told *NBC* it could be only ‘a matter of weeks’ if Iran continues to lift restraints in the JCPOA that the United States pulled out of under President Donald Trump...”

Upgraded Iron Dome missile system passes test with flying colors

February 1, 2021 Arutz Sheva 7 reported: “The Israel Missile Defense Organization (IMDO), in the Directorate for Defense R&D of the Israel Ministry of Defense, and Rafael Advanced Defense Systems have completed a successful series of flight tests of the Iron Dome weapon system.

The Israeli Air Force (IAF) and Navy also participated in the test, which was conducted in a base in central Israel.

The test campaign was held in a number of scenarios simulating advanced threats with which the Iron Dome is expected to contend during times of conflict – whether on land or in the sea.

The new and upgraded version of the Iron Dome is expected to be delivered to the IAF for operational use. It will also be integrated and installed on the Navy’s Sa’ar 6 corvettes and will be central to the defense of Israel’s economic waters...”
